## Please answer the following questions in writing:

- 1. If endorsed by the Chandler Chamber, what does your engagement plan look like with the Chamber and Arizona businesses following the election?
  - a. I've been involved in product development for 15 years, and since running my own company, one of my favorite parts of the entrepreneurship is Customer Discovery. Spending time with customers, understanding their problems, and then making sure we're building features that actually meet their needs. So far, my favorite part of campaigning has been meeting with businesses and their lobbyists because I get to learn about fascinating topics and see how I might be able to help if I get elected. My promise to people in our district is that while we may not always agree, I commit to listening, including to those who disagree with me.
- 2. Individual states compete globally for business development, attraction, and expansion. What are your plans to ensure Arizona continues to remain competitive not only in retaining its current businesses but in attracting new ones?
  - a. As a private business I have engaged with the Arizona Commerce Authority and seen first hand how they can encourage growth in our community. As an elected leader, I would be interested in in working with the ACA to make sure they have the resources needed to support local communities in their quest to bring high paying jobs to our state. Furthermore, as I mentioned in the recorded question #2, I believe that strong economies are places that incentivize innovation and then let those innovations thrive in a free market (as free as can reasonably be).
- 3. What measures do you support to improve and secure elections and voting access in Arizona?
